Freeholder Board Deputy Director John E. Lanza's nearly six year tenure on the Hunterdon County Board of Chosen Freeholders has been marked by numerous successes for residents and taxpayers including; lowering the County budget, holding the County tax rate steady, the preservation from development of thousands of acres of land, expanding shared services to the municipalities to help with their costs, and developing and implementing a plan for the County's future economic sustainability.

Freeholder Lanza presently serves as the Board's Veterans' liaison, as well as liaison for the Public Safety Department, Emergency Management, the 9-1-1 center, the Prosecutor's Office and for County Constitutional Officers. He served as Board Director in 2017.

A lifetime resident of Hunterdon County who lives with his wife and children in Raritan Township, Freeholder Lanza has been a practicing local attorney since 2001. He holds the distinction of having been appointed by the New Jersey Supreme Court to the District XIII Ethics Committee for attorneys.

Upon re-election in 2019, Freeholder Lanza expects to continue his efforts to expand professionalism and efficiency in the operation of the County government, to develop additional opportunities for shared services with the County's municipalities, and to continue the Freeholder Board's support for the Prosecutor's battle against opioid addiction.
